Defining Character Development

Character development is the intentional effort to help students understand, care about, and act on core values. It goes beyond academics by shaping ethical, responsible, and prosocial behavior. In high school, this work builds lifelong skills for sound judgment, responsibility, and purposeful decision-making.

Why Focus on High School?

High school is a critical period for identity and character formation. Academic, social, and digital pressures intensify, while peer influence grows. Decisions in this stage carry higher real-world consequences. Strong character skills support resilience, graduation, and post-secondary success.

Core Competencies of Character Development

Habituation through Practice – Building habits of honesty, kindness, and responsibility

Reflection on Personal Experience – Learning from successes and mistakes

Engagement with Virtue Concepts – Discussing fairness, respect, courage, gratitude

Dialogue and Reasoning – Talking through dilemmas with peers and adults

Awareness of Exemplars – Learning from stories and role models (teachers, characters)

Friendships of Mutual Accountability – Practicing respect, empathy, and responsibility with peers



Community and Culture – Reinforcing virtues through school routines, visuals, and celebrations

Anchor Routine – SCOPE-IT

Emozi® High School uses SCOPE-IT as its anchor self-regulation and problem-solving strategy:

- Stop – Pause before reacting; breathe and create space
- Consider – Notice feelings, facts, values, and context
- Options – Generate multiple responses; include doing nothing or asking for help
- Plan – Choose a values-aligned option and next steps
- Evaluate – Reflect on the outcome and unintended effects
- Insights – Identify what you learned about yourself and others
- Transform – Apply this learning to how you want to show up in the world
